Newest Art in Public Spaces

We cannot believe it has been 30 years since the beginnings of Patricia Carlisle Fine Art and the David Pearson journey. Dana and I met David and Patty over 25 years ago when we visited the gallery and fell in love with David's sculptures. Since then we have acquired 16 pieces for our personal collection and facilitated the purchase of 10 life size pieces for the City of Edmond, Oklahoma's Art in Public Places program. The last piece acquired for public art is *Aswan* which will be placed in the new Uncommon Ground sculpture park to open in the fall of 2026 in Edmond, Oklahoma. Also, David's *Silent Desert* already located in historic downtown will be relocated to the Uncommon Ground.

Uncommon Ground is a 62 acre sculpture park under construction by a private individual that will be conveyed to a City of Edmond, Oklahoma public trust. It is scheduled to open in the fall of 2026, along historic Route 66, which will

also be the 100th anniversary of that historic road. The park will have at least 60 sculptures when opening and also be the home of the Fine Arts Institute of Edmond, a nonprofit art teaching facility.

The purchase of 10 works for public art is a testament to the universal appeal of David Pearson's sculptures, as each was purchased as part of Edmond's public/private program, i.e. a private donor picked the piece and paid half of the price and the City matched the other half.

Lastly, David and Patty have become some of our dearest friends, adding beauty and joy to our lives. Great friends and great art. It does not get any better except when adding one of David's Grand Marnier margaritas to the mix.
